Countryside Police Racial Profiling Policy

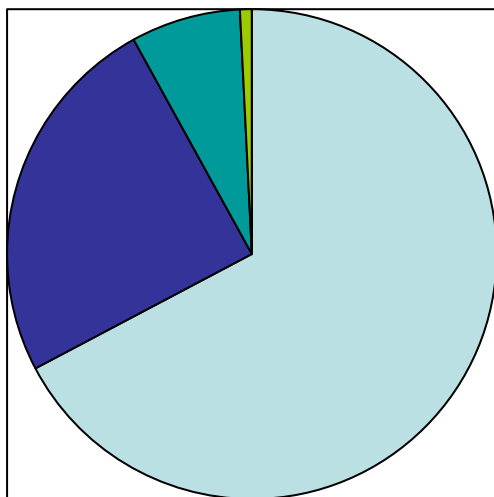
POLICY:

It is the policy of the Countryside Police Department to patrol in a proactive manner, to aggressively investigate suspicious persons and circumstances, and to actively enforce the motor vehicle laws, while insisting that citizens will only be stopped or detained when there exists reasonable suspicion to believe they have committed, are committing, or are about to commit an infraction of the law.

Northwestern University will be finalizing a more in-depth study for all police departments in Illinois; this should be available around July 2005.
