The Cook County Department of Transportation and Highways (DOTH) has initiated the Plainfield Road Corridor Phase I Study. Plainfield Road is a two-lane roadway under the jurisdiction of Cook County DOTH, located in the southwest suburbs of Cook County. The study corridor is approximately 3.5 miles long, from County Line Road to East Avenue. The objective of this Phase I study is to address the existing roadway and drainage deficiencies, enhance the bicycle/

pedestrian accommodations, and improve safety and mobility for all users.

The study will develop proposed improvements based on stakeholders' input and technical analysis and examine the impacts that the proposed improvements will have on the community and the environment.
