1-29-22	3:05 AM	6003 Joliet Rd, T-Mobile	Burglary	The offender broke the window on the T-Mobile store and stole iPhones. It appears that the same offender also hit T-Mobile stores in Lyons and Bridgeview and possibly Crest Hill the same morning. We believe that this offender is related to several other burglaries in the area including Marry Me Jewelry. Offender is driving a white Acura MDX and appears to be a male possible White or Hispanic.
1-28-22	9:00 AM	9630 Joliet Rd, Cora Italian Specialties	Forgery	The offender attempted to electronically cash a check against the business account which is held at Countryside Bank. The bank suspected this as fraudulent and did not cash it. It is suspected that the check was stolen in the mail and "washed."
1-29-22	8:25 PM	5555 Brainard, TJ Maxx	Retail Theft	The offender, described as: heavy set male black, tall (approximately 6'00"), wearing all black clothing, pushed a glass display case containing high end items into the lot. Once inside the lot the offender broke the glass and removed several items. The offender fled west bound Plainfield Rd in an unknown black vehicle.
1-29-22	5:01 PM	140 Countryside Plaza, Home Depot	Retail Theft	The offenders stole several spools of electrical wire and fled the area in a Ford Crown Victoria or Mercury Marauder, champagne in color. The offenders were described as a male and female black in their 40's.
1-30-22	8:30 PM	Countryside	Theft by Deception	The victim attempted to purchase a vehicle through "Offer Up" on the internet. The seller requested payment via eBay gift cards. The victim is out \$1,400. Never pay for anything online where the offender requests payment made using a gift card.
1-31-22	10:35 AM	9600 blk 55 th Street	Attempted Vehicle Theft / Criminal Trespass to vehicle	The victim reported that on 1/30/22 at 0259hrs an offender broke in to a Ford F550 truck and attempted to steal it. The driver's side door lock of the vehicle and the ignition were damaged in the attempt. A GPS tracking unit was also removed from inside the vehicle and located on the ground outside the vehicle.

2-1-22	10:45 AM	1400 blk 55 th Street	Battery	The offender attempted to leave a store without paying for merchandise. When a store employee confronted the offender an argument ensued which led to the offender pushing the employee before fleeing the scene. The offender was described as a male black approximately 25-35 years old. The store employee was able to provide a photograph of the vehicle the offender fled in.
2-1-22	2:59 PM	600 blk W Plainfield	Forgery	The victim reported that an unknown offender attempted to cash a fake check using the business' bank account information on 1/22/22 at an unknown location in Michigan.
2-1-22	6:07 PM	Countryside Plaza	Criminal Damage to Property	The victim reported that an unknown offender scratched a large 'X' in her front driver's side door while the victim's vehicle was parked in Countryside Plaza on 2/1/22 between 1:15pm and 1:50pm.
2-1-22	11:01 PM	6200 blk Joliet Road	Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts (Catalytic Converter)	On 2/1/22 at 11:01 pm an employee of the business heard the sound of a saw coming from underneath a pickup truck in the business parking lot The employee observed a male black approximately 6ft 2in tall wearing all black laying on the ground by the car stand up and enter a black Chevrolet Impala before fleeing the area. The responding officer investigated and found that the catalytic converter was missing from the pickup truck.
2-2-22	11:42 AM	6200 blk Joliet Road	Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts (Catalytic Converter)	The victim reported that his vehicle was parked in the business parking lot overnight. The responding officer located surveillance footage showing that at approximately 11:00 pm the night prior a black Chevrolet Impala parked next to the victim's vehicle. The Impala's front passenger exited the Impala and was observed moving around the victim's vehicle before leaving towards Joliet Road. This appears to be the same offenders as the above listed catalytic converter theft.

When officers confronted Rodriguez he disobeyed police commands to exit the vehicle and fled by driving over the lawn also committing several traffic violations before heading onto Plainfield Rd. While officers were unable to capture Rodriguez he is still wanted on multiple offenses.
2-1-22	10:43 PM	Joliet Road & LaGrange Road	Burglary & Traffic Offenses	Issac Aviles, M/21 yoa, Chicago IL	Officer Brunke observed a white Acura MDX operated by Aviles commit several traffic violations. The Acura also matched the description of the offending vehicle from a burglary that occurred at Marry Me Jewelry on 1-28-22. Officer Brunke conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle. The traffic stop and subsequent investigation led to the Cook County State's Attorney approving a felony charge of Burglary against Aviles. Investigation of Aviles' possible involvement in other burglaries in Countryside and other jurisdictions is still underway.
